JSDAInc. Q1/Q2 projects were strong, including two start up organizations and a restaurant. The increasing interest rates slowed the fall.projects, and unexpected poor soil conditions redirected a new construction project. Urban housing opportunities currently under exploration. We continued building our portfolio of commercial and residential projects, expanding into digital drone imaging. JSDAInc., contributes thought leadership through Linkedin and were invited to speak on the Future of Work at INL.

12M square feet of vacant office space in downtown LA indicate a shifting market in southern California. Further impacted by entertainment industry strikes, commercial workspaces are changing slowly relative to evolving hybrid work practices, co-working and regionalized workspaces.

October 2023 report by **JP Morgan** shows Boise as the nation's breakaway leader in urban recovery with a score of 73/100, outranking Austin Texas and San Francisco. The city has an "ease of doing business" score of 83, and an economic growth score of 82. With an 11% office vacancy rate, the lowest in the country. – BoiseDev



Adaptive Reuse

A former Greyhound Bus Terminal designed by Hummel, Hummel & Jones in 1959 had been abandoned in 2019. A unique downtown property that hosted a stout two story steel frame building with parking on three d to occupy the sides. The new tenant, a non-profit start up, was offe ed excee space immediately. We were invited to guide the recent architecture degreed U of Idaho alumni, design and code. Our analysis located the original drawings, permit and historical documentation for the location to be placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Many of the existing original finishes, terrazzo lobby floor, glazed concrete wall tiles, concealed spline ceilings and plumbing fixtures remained in the building. The City of Boise was consulted on the change of use, as the new tenant wished to convert the space into business/office use and add a theater where the original bus café had been located. Treefort had occupied the restaurant as a makeshift theatre, which inspired the idea. Due to the change in use, the facility was in need of health and safety, exiting, lighting and mechanical system upgrades.
